What are you investing in?

• Investment Policy

- Minimum 80% of NAV in average of fund accounting year are invested in the master fund named, JPMorgan Investment Funds - Global Income Fund (Master Fund) (ISIN Code:LU0815074496).

- The master fund focuses on investment in debt securities, equity instruments, and trust units of Real Estate Investment Trust (REITs) issued by issuers located in other countries including countries in emerging markets.

- The Management Company reserves the right to change the type and feature of the Fund to a “fund of funds” or making direct investments in foreign instruments and/or securities or to revert to “feeder fund” in the future without increasing the risk spectrum of the Fund. In this respect, the change shall be made at the Fund Manager’s discretion according to market situation by taking into consideration the utmost benefits of the unitholders.

• Management Style

- The fund aims to track investment return of the master fund (passive management).

- The master fund aims to generate higher return than the benchmark (active management).



Who is the fund suitable for?

- Investors who can accept fluctuation of prices of stocks, which may increase or decrease to the level below the initial investment, resulting in a loss.

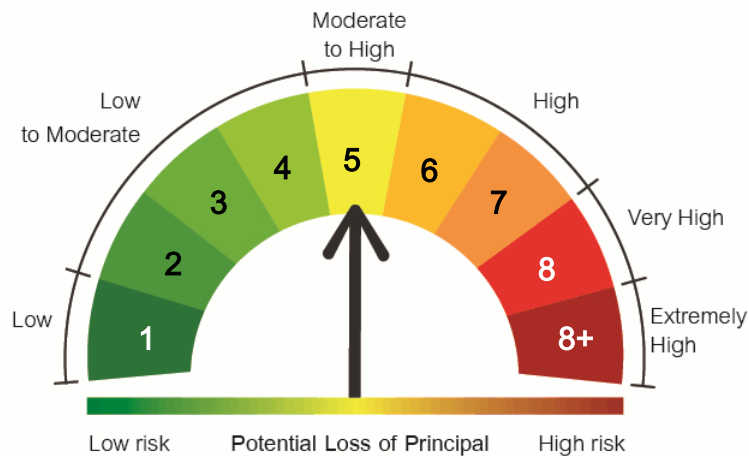


What are the key risks of the Fund?

• Important Risk Warnings

- The master fund invests in debt instruments, equity instruments and trust units of Real Estate Investment Trust (REITs) issued by issuers located in other countries including countries in emerging markets that contain the market risks in association with economy, politics or society. Such market risks can affect business to the extent that change the market condition and consequently affect stock prices.
- The fund may invest in forward contract to enhance portfolio efficiency and may invest in structured note. This may contain higher risks than investing directly in underlying securities.

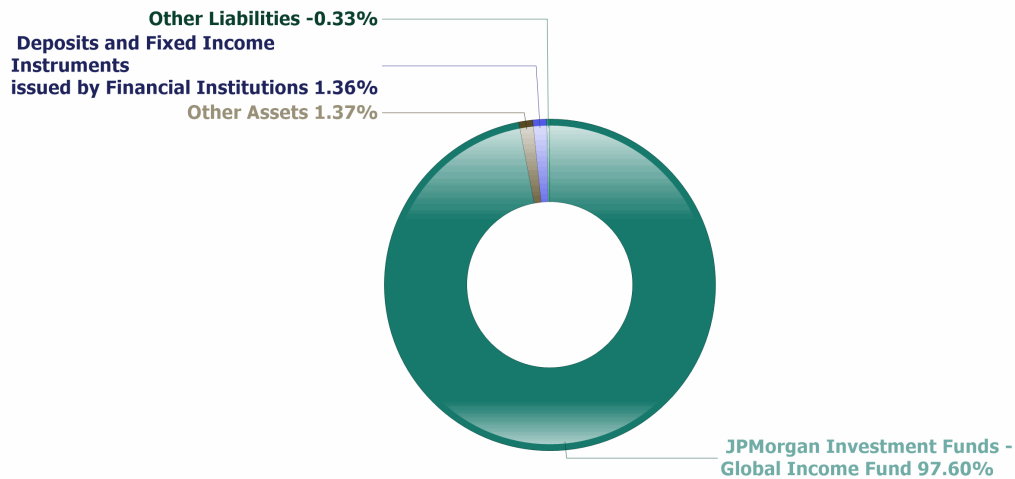

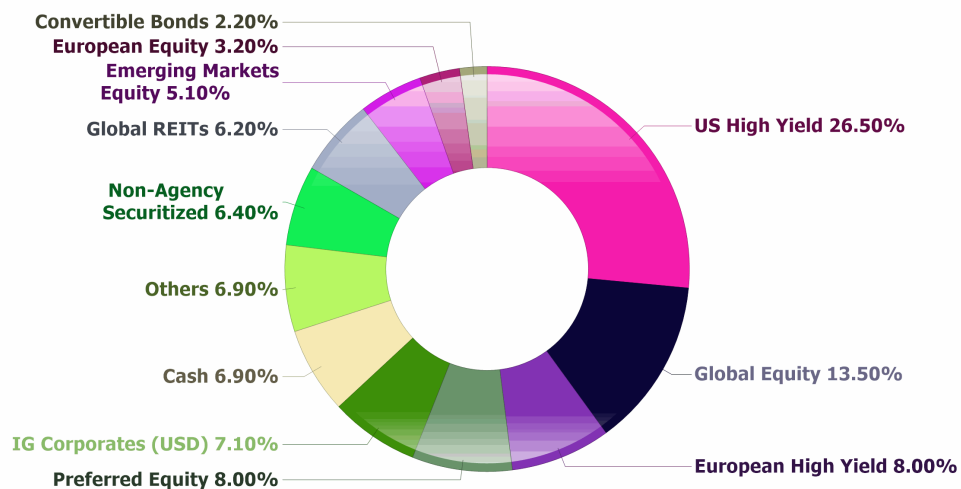


Asset allocation

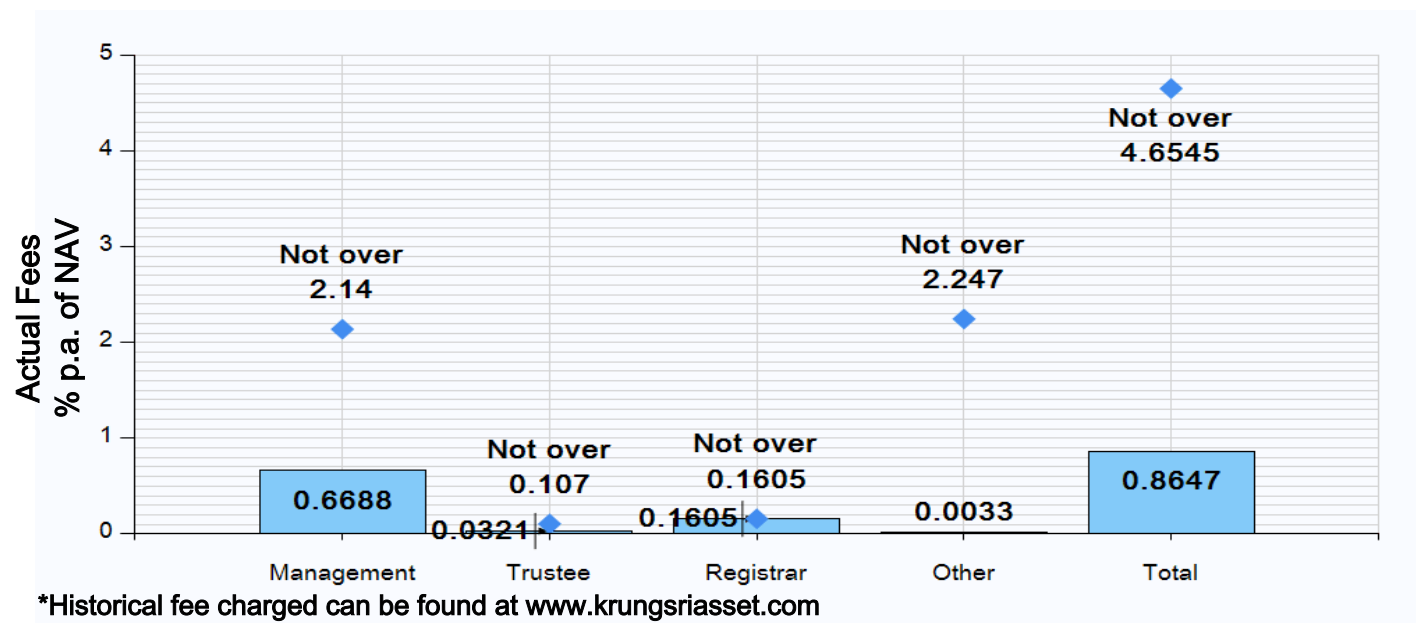

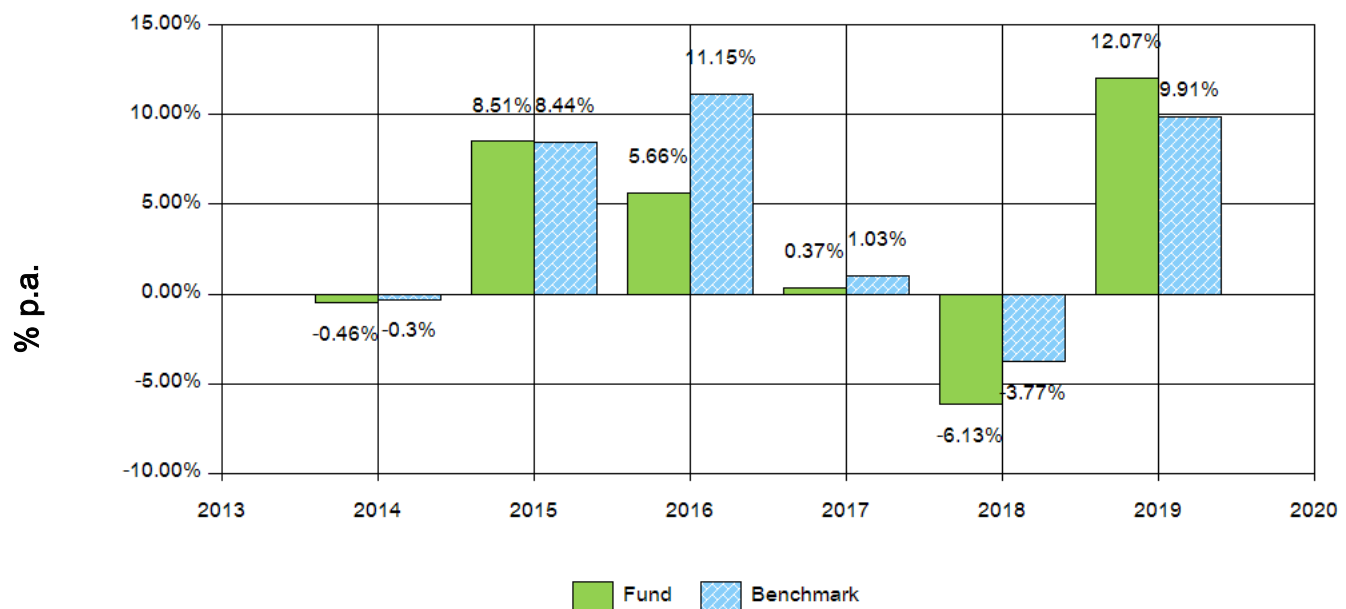

9.Other Information
