What are you investing in?

(1) Investment Policy

- Krungsri Global Fixed Income 1Y1 Fund: Minimum 80% of Funds assets in average of fund accounting year are invested in the Master Fund named, Eastspring Investments Unit Trusts - Fixed Income Plan Series 3, Class I1 USD.
- Eastspring Investments Unit Trusts - Fixed Income Plan Series 3 (Master Fund): To invest directly in bonds and other debt securities primarily in the Asia Pacific region and Emerging Markets. The Fund may also invest in bonds and other debt securities in the developed markets. The Fund will invest at least 80% of its NAV in investment grade bonds and 20% or less of its NAV in non-investment grade bonds.
- The Fund may invest in non-investment grade or unrated securities, with the total portion of such investments combined with the investments of the Master Fund not exceeding 20% of the Fund's NAV. However, since this Fund adopts a Buy-and-Hold investment strategy, in the case where such securities at the time of investing have obtained the value of not exceeding the prescribed investment limit but the value later exceeds such limit which is not caused by any additional investment, the Management Company will continue to hold such securities without having to reduce the investment proportion.
- The Fund may invest in structured notes in accordance with the rules as specified by the SEC Office.
- The Fund may engage in derivatives contracts for the purpose of foreign exchange hedging and for enhance efficiency portfolio management at the discretion of the management company.
- The Management Company reserves the right to change the type and feature of the Fund to a "fund of funds" or making direct investments in foreign instruments and/or securities or to revert to "feeder fund" in the future without increasing the risk spectrum of the Fund. In this respect, the change shall be made at the Fund Manager's discretion according to market situation by taking into consideration the utmost benefits of the unitholders.

(2) Management Style

- This is a buy-and-hold fund where the fund makes investment once and holds the assets until maturity.



Who is the Fund suitable for?

- Investors who can accept fluctuation in price of securities in which the Fund invests, which may increase or decrease to below the value of investment and thus resulting in loss.
- Investors who expect higher return than deposits and can accept possible lower return than investment in stocks.
- Investors who require investment return from short-term fixed income.

This mutual fund is not suitable for

- Investors who cannot accept volatility of investment capital and short-term return.
- Investors who prefer fixed rate of return or preserve full amount of principal.
- Investors who prefer to invest only in high quality, high liquidity and low price fluctuation of debt instruments. The investable assets and restrictions of money market fund is not applied to this fund.
- Investors who need to redeem units within 1 year.

What to do if you still don't understand the policy and risks of this fund?

- Study the full prospectus or **enquire** the selling agents and the management company.
- **You should not invest in the Fund if you do not understand it or are not comfortable with the accompanying risks.**

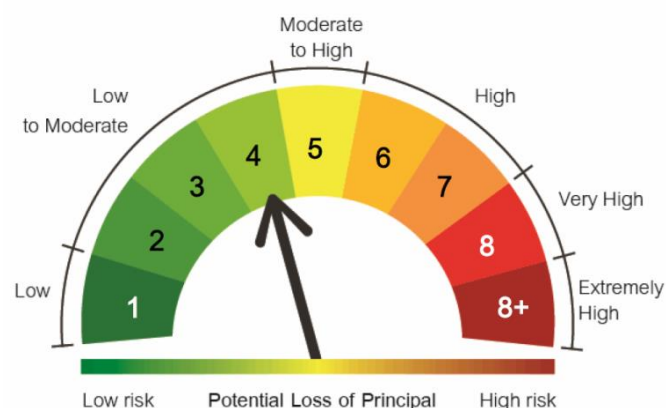


What are the key risks of the Fund?

Important Warning

- The Master Fund invests in non-investment grade or unrated securities which may be issued by companies in emerging markets, the investors therefore may be exposed to higher level of default risk.
- The Fund may enter into a currency swap within discretion of the Management Company which may incur transaction costs. The increased costs will reduce overall return. In absence of a currency swap, investors may lose or gain from foreign exchange or receive lower return than the amount initially invested.
- The Thai Fund and/or the Master Fund may invest in forward contract to enhance efficiency portfolio management and structured note. This means the Fund may contain higher risks than other funds which invest directly in underlying assets. Therefore, it may have gain/loss higher than investing directly in underlying assets.
- This Fund has limited liquidity since it is not open for trading as general open-ended mutual funds. The Fund is subject to automatic redemption only upon maturity.
- The Master Fund is traded on every business day. Therefore, in the case where there occurs any significantly large redemptions and the Management Company deems that such redemptions may adversely affect the investment or performance of the Master Fund, resulting in the Master fund being no longer an appropriate investment; or in the case that the Master Fund notifies the Management Company of its dissolution before maturity, the Management Company may proceed to dissolve the Fund before maturity of the fund scheme if it is unable to find a new Master Fund to replace the existing one.
- The Master Fund adopts a Buy-and-Hold investment strategy. The investment manager of the Master Fund shall review the quality of the invested securities on a regular basis, which may result in rebalancing of investment portfolio during the holding period if the credit ratings of the securities invested by the Master Fund incur significant changes that might have an adverse impact on the default risk of the invested bonds or debt instruments.
- The IPO of the Master Fund is expected to be launched on 19 August 2021 Accordingly, there may be the risk that the Master Fund is unable to get registered. Under such circumstance, the Management Company shall return the full amount of subscription proceeds to the investors without deducting any expenses relating to the Fund.
- This mutual fund's investment is highly concentrated in China, therefore investors should consider diversify the risks in their portfolio.

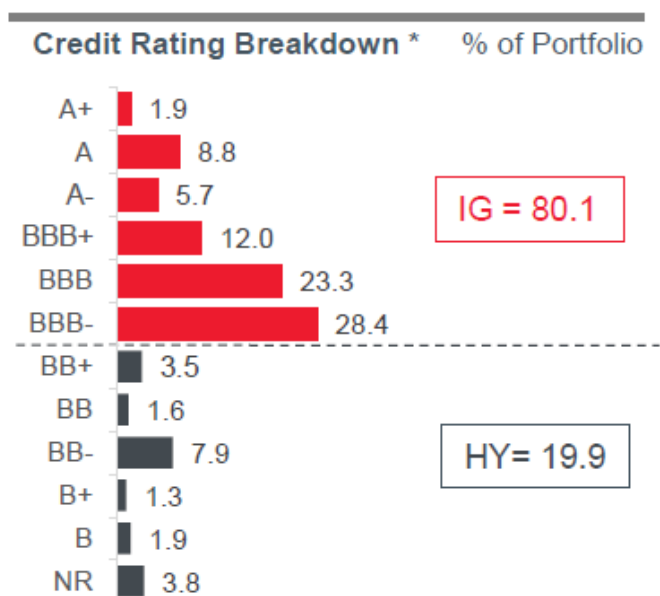
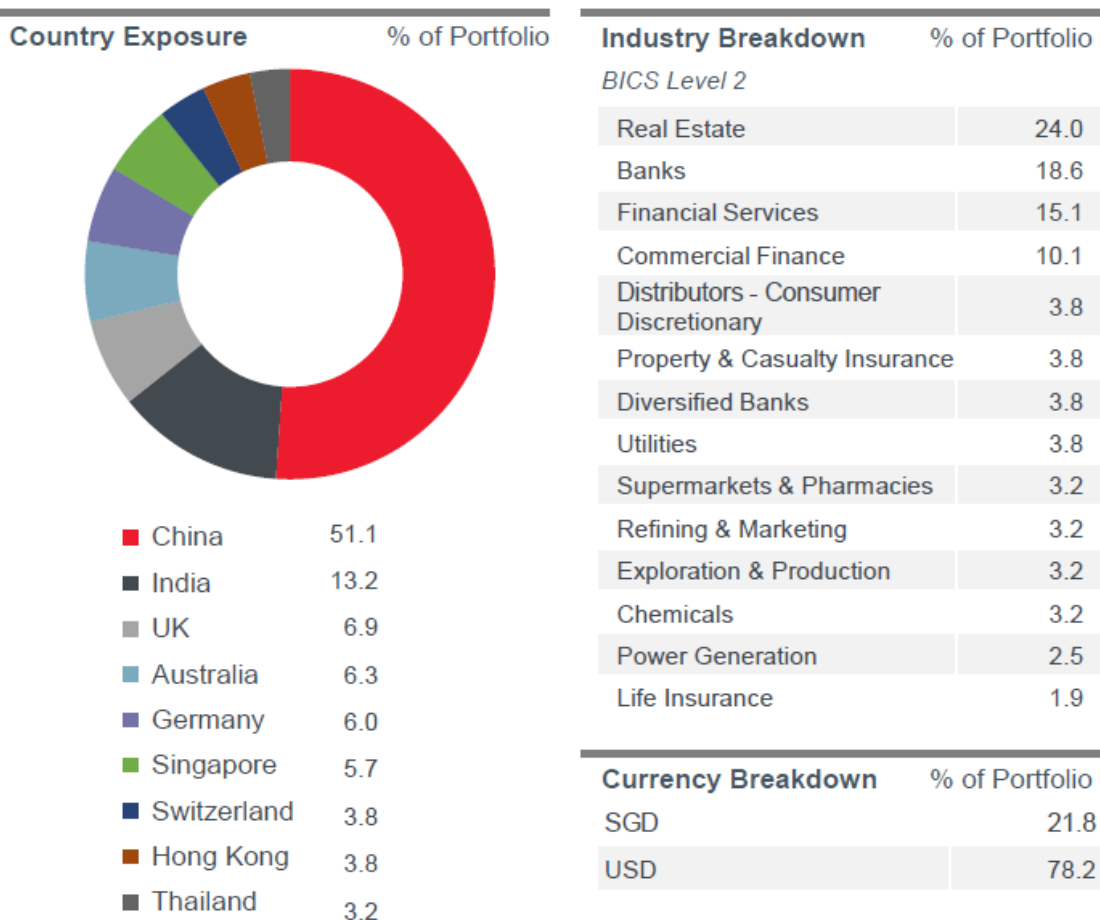

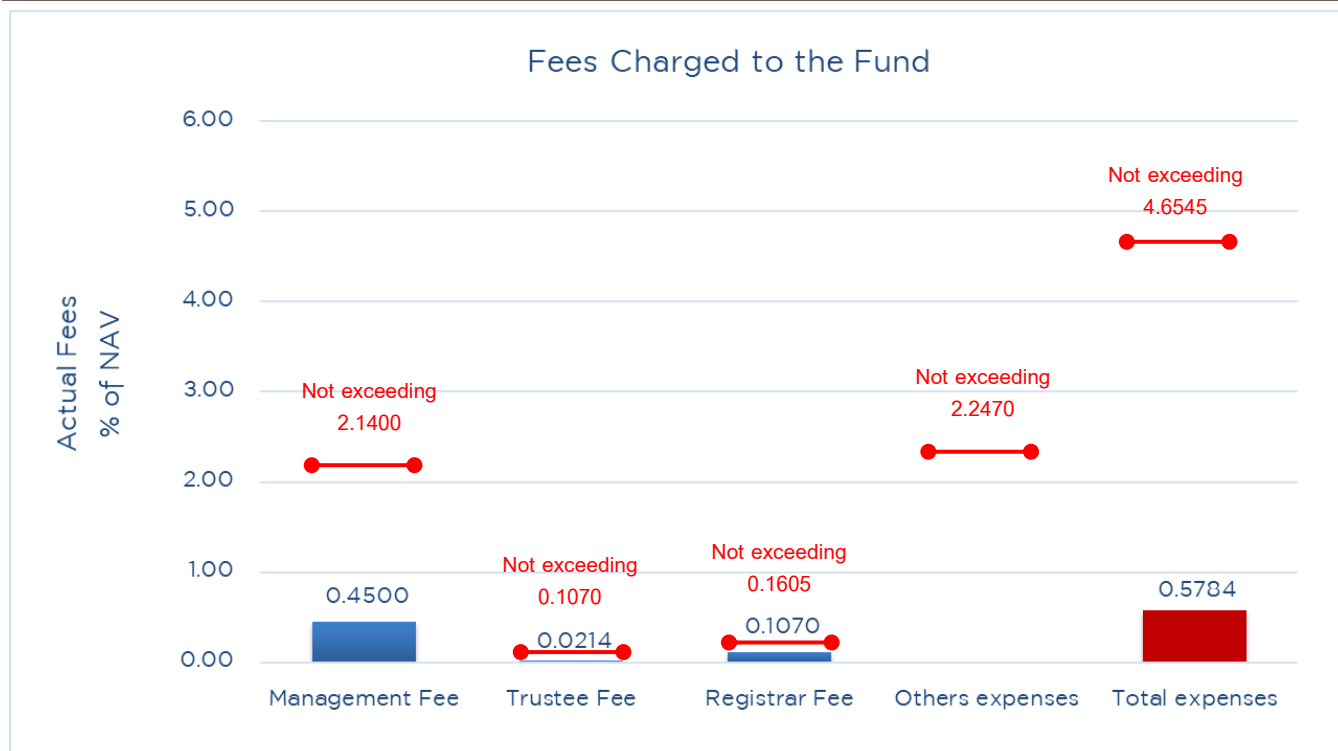

Investment Objective:	The Fixed Income Plan Series 3 aims to generate income over the tenure of the Fund and return the initial investment upon maturity by investing in a portfolio of bonds and other debt securities primarily in the Asia Pacific region and Emerging Markets. The Fund may also invest in bonds and other debt securities in the developed markets. The Fund is not a capital guaranteed or capital protected product.
Investment Strategy and Approach:	<p>As at the inception of the Fund, the Manager will invest:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • at least 80% of its NAV in investment grade bonds; and • 20% or less of its NAV in non-investment grade bonds. <p>As at the inception of the Fund, the average credit rating of the portfolio will be at least BBB (investment grade), following the rating of international credit rating agencies such as Standard & Poor's, Moody's or Fitch Ratings. The Fund will invest in USD-denominated bonds issued in the Asia Pacific region and Emerging Markets. The Manager intends to buy and hold the securities with active monitoring during the product tenure. There may be portfolio turnover should there be material credit developments which impact default risks of a bond or debt security or if there are more attractive investment opportunities. The Fund may employ derivatives for hedging or efficient portfolio management purposes.</p> <p>Over the tenure of the Fund, the allocation between investment grade bonds and non-investment grade bonds may change as (1) the credit rating of the investment may change over the course of the fixed investment period; and (2) the cash received (in the form of coupons, or from the disposal of underlying investments or portfolio holdings maturing) and re-invested into cash or cash equivalents may increase as a percentage of the overall assets over the course of the fixed investment period. Explanation of Risk

Explanation on Credit Risk

Credit Risk is assessed based on the credit rating that indicates the level on which an issuer can meet its financial commitments, taking into consideration the past performance and the financial position of the issuer. Below is a summary of credit rating of long-term bonds.

Explanation on Market Risk

- Market Risk is the possibility for an investor to experience losses resulting from changes in interest rates that depend on external factors such as investment and economic conditions, political factors in the issuer's country or other country. Fixed-income instrument prices and interest rates move in opposite directions. For example, if the interest rate in the money market increases, prices of newly issued instruments will be high and therefore instruments that have been issued previously will be traded at lower prices. Mutual funds of long portfolio duration have higher chance of experiencing changes in prices than mutual funds of shorter portfolio duration.
- Market risk is the possibility that the value of securities in which the mutual fund invests may increase or decrease due to external factors such as investment climate, domestic and foreign politics. This is measured in terms of standard deviation (SD) of the mutual fund. If the SD is high, the fund is likely to experience fluctuate in prices of securities.

■ Explanation on Currency Risk

Currency Risk is the possibility that changes in exchange rate will affect the value of investment units. For example, if a mutual fund invests in securities denominated in US Dollar during Thai Baht depreciation and the units are subsequently sold when Thai Baht appreciates, the mutual fund will receive lower return in Thai Baht. On the other hand, if the same fund invests in securities denominated in US Dollar during Thai Baht appreciation and the units are subsequently sold when Thai Baht depreciates, the mutual fund will receive higher return in Thai Baht. Therefore, currency hedging techniques as follows are key tools to manage such risk.

Fully-hedged: Investors have no exposure to currency risk.

Partially-hedged with fixed ratio: Investors may be exposed to certain level of currency risk.

Hedging at discretion of the fund manager: Investors may be exposed to currency risk because it is the discretion of the fund manager whether to use a currency hedging technique.

No hedging: Investors will experience currency risk.

■ Explanation on High Issuer Concentration Risk

- (1) High Issuer Concentration Risk arising from the Fund investing in a single issuer of securities more than 10% of the total NAV. If there is any circumstance that adversely affects the performance, financial status, or stability of such issuer, the Fund may encounter higher volatility in performance than funds that diversify their investment among many issuers.
- (2) Sector Concentration Risk arising from the Fund investing in a single sector more than 20% of the total NAV. If there is any circumstance that adversely affects such industry, the Fund may encounter higher volatility in performance than funds that diversify their investment among many sectors.
- (3) Country Concentration Risk arising from the Fund investing in a single country more than 20% of the total NAV. If there is any circumstance that adversely affects such country, e.g., political, economic, or social developments, etc., the Fund may encounter higher volatility in performance than funds that diversify their investment among many countries.
